CHURCHWARDENS REPORT 2022 ST. LUKE'S

We have had another busy year at St. Luke's with the building at full capacity several days each week, with 13 groups meeting regularly. Our Saturday morning Cuppa and Chat in the main hall has been a notable success this year, and has become a place for regular socialising, for those using Parish Pantry, church members and friends, and others who come in for a free breakfast. This time has also been used by the East

Suffolk Financial Inclusion team to offer help and advice, an opportunity to distribute Comfort Food Vouchers and electricity vouchers, and to offer help in other ways.

Parish Pantry has seen a vast increase in the number of people coming for food, with an average of 40 each week. We continue to receive generous help from Morrisons each week and also a generous donation from Townlands Trust and from individuals.

We had several notable events during the year, one of which was a Jubilee Tea, which took the form of a street party in the hall. This was a very happy occasion attended by around 80 local people. This was followed within a few months by the church being open specifically for people to come in to sign a Book of Condolence after the death of Queen Elizabeth.

Our Carols and Candles was a great joy especially as some of our Parish Pantry friends came along as they felt they wanted to and they consider this to be their church.

We held our Christmas Market on a Friday evening, which proved very successful, and a Christmas Dinner for over 70 people of all ages, both great team efforts which brought joy to many.

We have, of course had some sad events too. We have lost some longstanding members of our church; notably Jim Lumsden, Angela Morgan, Di Fleming and Brian Holland.

Throughout the year there has been ongoing maintenance to the building, including a new Fire door in the main hall, and the reduction in size of the radiator covers, both of which have made a vast improvement to maintaining heat. Our 5 year electrical inspection and all PAT testing have been successfully completed.
